During a meeting he held on Somalia square, on 12 May, the Commissioner addressed several thousands inhabitants of the Mercato and Caravanserraglio quarters.

UN Commissioner in Eritrea Holds Public Meetings in Asmara

Dr. Eduardo Anze Matienzo, UN Commissioner in Eritrea, completed a series of public meetings at which he has been addressing the residents of Asmara.

This peaceful meeting, attended by the Moslems from the Acria quarter and the Copts from Gheza Banda, is held on the scene of the bloody riots of February 1950.

Eritrea Becomes Autonomous

Less than two years after the UN General Assembly resolution granting self-rule to Eritrea, the former Italian colony has become an autonomous state federated with Ethiopia.

Eduardo Anze Matienzo (second from right), UN Commissioner in Eritrea, had to prepare the population for the change. Through cosultations with all groups, he found that generally there was unanimity in favour of the principle of federation, but many differences of opinion on details. He stressed the need to think of the welfare of the country as a whole rather than in terms of tribal and local influences.

Eritreans Vote For Representative Assembly

The first election in the history of Eritrea was held on 26 March 1952 when a Representative Assembly was elected by secret ballot. 


Eritreans Vote For Representative Assembly
